A Reminder About the Foster Care and Adoption Individual Categorical Codes in MA Cases

Please note that this piece is for local districts only and that a General Information System (GIS) message had been written on this subject - GIS 08-#002 dated February 15, 2008.

On 2/15/08 GIS 08-#002 was issued advising local districts of the creation of new WMS Medicaid Individual Category Codes (ICC) for foster and adopted children. These codes, in addition to already existing category codes, should be used by local districts when opening a Medicaid case for foster children - case type 13 or 20 - or when opening a Medicaid adoption subsidy case. The chart below includes both new and existing individual category codes. The use of these codes will help to identify children in foster care that are in receipt of Medicaid.

SSI Blind Foster Care	79 (new code)

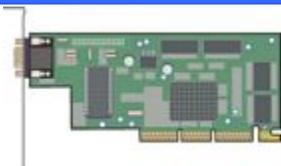
