SUBJECT: Preliminary ADC Collection Goals for SFY 1990-91 and
Incentive Information

The New York State Legislature, through Chapter 53 of the laws of 1990, has raised the ADC collection goal for state fiscal year 1990-91 (4/1/90-3/31/91) from \$130,000,000 to \$136,400,000. Additionally, the Department, subject to approval of the Director of Budget, is authorized to retain a percentage of federal incentive payments received under Title IV-D of the federal Social Security Act. The percentage retained is equal to the total 1989-1990 state costs incurred in administering Title IV-D activities divided by the total 1989-90 state and local costs incurred in administering Title IV-D activities. However, the total amount retained by the state shall not exceed \$4,500,000. Estimated monthly incentive amounts for the period 5/1/90 through 9/30/90, with the \$4,500,000 state share factored in, were issued under a separate cover dated May 30, 1990.

The attached list contains the preliminary distribution of the \$136.4 million ADC collection goal for SFY 1990-91 for each district. Experience with the factors used to formulate the allocation methodology since 1979 has demonstrated reliable relationships. Therefore, the same methodology was used in determining the preliminary goals shown in the attached. We are presently requesting approval from the Division of Budget for the goals so that we may issue them in final form by Administrative Directive. As in prior years, we expect individual county goals, as approved in final form, will not vary significantly from the preliminary goal.
