Proclamation

Whereas, mentoring is a highly effective strategy for enriching the lives of New York State's children and young adults by teaming them up with caring, responsible adults who can provide guidance, direction, and positive influence on their lives; and

Whereas, mentors help to promote healthy development and self-confidence in our youth through relationships built on mutual trust and respect; and

Whereas, research shows that quality mentoring is effective in helping young people make responsible decisions, stay focused and engaged in school, and decrease or avoid risky behaviors and dangerous activities; and

Whereas, January is designated as National Mentoring Month to raise awareness of the value of mentoring, and this year's theme, *Mentoring Works*, emphasizes the positive outcomes mentoring has in the areas of academic achievement and social behavior, workforce development, employee satisfaction and retention, and community engagement; and

Whereas, recruitment of qualified mentors is an important goal of National Mentoring Month, which focuses on engaging more community members in volunteering as mentors, and sharing the message: "Be Someone Who Matters to Someone Who Matters;" and

Whereas, January 9, 2014 "I Am a Mentor Day" and January 16, 2014 "Thank Your Mentor Day" recognize dedicated mentors who give generously of themselves and who exemplify the value of mentoring; and

Whereas, it is fitting that New Yorkers recognize the importance of mentoring, acknowledge the caring individuals who serve as mentors, and encourage more people to help build a brighter future for the youth of New York through mentoring;

Now, Therefore, I, Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York, do hereby proclaim January 2014 as
