The New York State Commission for the Blind (NYSCB) works with NY residents of all ages who are legally blind to help them live independent lives by providing counseling, rehabilitation training and employment services.



NYSCB services may include:

- Home and personal management training
- Navigation and travel training
- Low vision examinations and aids
- Help keeping your current job
- Vocational training
- Assistance with post-secondary education
- Assistive technology training
- Training in reading Braille
- Work readiness training
- Work experience opportunities
- Connection to community resources

Who is eligible?

Any New York State resident who is legally blind or deaf-blind may be eligible for services provided by NYSCB.

If you are working and severely visually impaired but not yet legally blind, you may qualify for “Job Save” services.

Legal blindness is defined as:

- A visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better or stronger eye with best correction, OR
- A restricted field of vision of 20 degrees or less in the better or stronger eye.

Programs

Employment Program

NYSCB can assist you in getting ready to work, keeping your current job, or starting a business. A vocational rehabilitation counselor will help you plan for and get the training you need to reach your employment goal.

Business Enterprise Program (BEP)

Are you a U.S. citizen interested in managing your own newsstand, snack bar or cafeteria? The BEP program provides training to get you up and running plus ongoing support.

Independent Living Program

If you are an adult or senior who wants to live as independently as possible but are not interested in employment, NYSCB has programs to teach you the skills to maintain your home, travel safely, and keep in touch with family and neighbors.

Children’s Program

Children can receive services at home, in their community, and at rehabilitation agencies. Children’s consultants provide guidance to families, advocacy services, educational consultation and vocational coordination.
