



Subsidized Child Care in New York State (Federal Fiscal Year 2019)

- \$832 Million allocated to local districts for the NYSCCBG child care subsidy program in SFY2019-20.
- Approximately 169,000 children in 101,000 families received child care subsidies in FFY 2019 (annual).
- Approximately 109,000 children in 63,000 families received child care subsidies each month.
- Approximately 64% of children served are from NYC.
- Approximately 43% of children with child care subsidies were in families receiving Temporary Assistance, while 57% were not in receipt of TA (low income cases).
- There are approximately 13,700 legally exempt providers enrolled to provide subsidized child care.

Division of Child Care Services Miscellaneous Contracts/MOUs for SFY 2019-20

- 32 Child Care Resource & Referral Contracts - \$16.9 million - incl. NYC with one lead and three subcontractors.
- Seven Infant/Toddler Resource Center Contracts - \$3.3 million.
- 37 Registration Contracts/MOUs - \$19.6 million.
- 32 Legally-Exempt Enrollment Agency Contracts - \$9.4 million.
- Child Care Subsidy MOUs for income-eligible families: SUNY \$2.213 million; CUNY \$2.161 million.
- NYS Agriculture & Markets MOU supports Centers for children of migrant and farm workers - \$750,000.
- Unified Court Systems MOU supports Children's Centers - \$150,000.

Advantage After School Program: Approximately 16,500 children and youth will be served through 149 contracts with 201 program sites - \$33 million.

Empire State After School Program: Approximately 34,300 children and youth will be served through 80 contracts with approx. 327 program sites - \$55 million

• <u>DCC=Day Care Center</u> – provide care to an enrolled group of 7 or more children at a facility other than a personal residence. Maximum capacity is driven by square footage allowance.
• <u>FDC=Family Day Care Home</u> – provide care to more than 2 non-relative children in a residence. Max. capacity: 8 children / caregiver.
• <u>GFDC=Group Family Day Care Home</u> – provide care to more than 2 non-relative children in a residence. Maximum capacity: 16 children / 2 caregivers.
• <u>SACC=School Age Child Care</u> – provide care to an enrolled group of 7 or more children in a non-residence facility outside normal school hours. Maximum capacity is drive by square footage allowance.
• <u>LE=Legally Exempt Enrolled</u> - providers of subsidized child care services, who are not required to be licensed or registered, but who meet minimum health and safety standards required for enrollment.
