I. Purpose

The purpose of this Administrative Directive is to advise local social services districts of the allocation of closed-ended Federal and State services funds for the Federal Fiscal Year 1979-80 (see attached Appendix A).

II. Background


New York State's share of the Federal Title XX basic social services funds allotment has been reduced this year by 1.65%. All local districts' ceilings have been reduced accordingly. However, those districts which receive under \$6 per capita in their basic Title XX Federal allocation shall receive an additional amount corresponding to approximately 40% of their deficit to \$6 per capita. New York City will receive an additional amount of \$3.95 million in Federal funds.
