

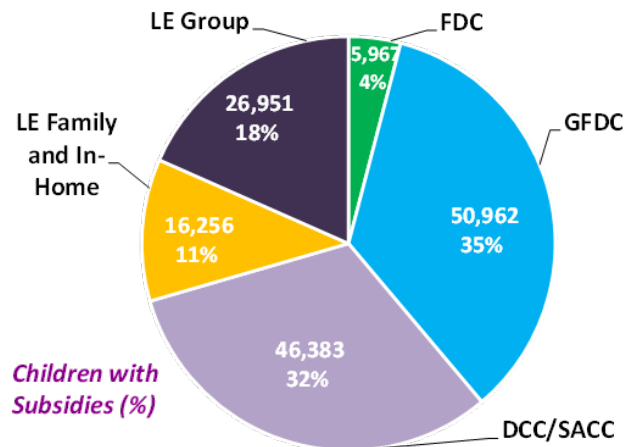

The Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) (Federal Fiscal Year 2023)

- NYSCCBG funding available: \$1.996B for FFY2023 and \$941M for FFY2024 (does not include an estimated \$900M in rollover funds or any additional claim-based allocations that may be made to implement expanded eligibility and streamlining initiatives).
- Approximately 147,000 children in 80,000 families received child care assistance in FFY 2023 (annual).
- Approximately 90,000 children in 53,000 families received child care assistance each month.
- Approximately 57% of children served are from NYC.
- Approximately 24% of children with child care assistance were in families receiving Temporary Assistance, while 76% were not in receipt of TA (low-income cases).
- There are approximately 9,200 legally exempt providers enrolled to provide child care for CCAP recipients.

Division of Child Care Services Miscellaneous Contracts/MOUs for SFY 2023-2024

- 32 Child Care Resource & Referral Contracts - \$16.9 million - incl. NYC with one lead and three subcontractors.
- Seven Infant/Toddler Resource Center Contracts - \$6.5 million.
- 37 Registration Contracts/MOUs - \$26 million (NYC received an increase for 2023).
- 32 Legally Exempt Enrollment Agency Contracts - \$26.9 million.
- Child Care Subsidy MOUs for income-eligible families: SUNY \$2.213 million; CUNY \$2.161 million.
- NYS Agriculture and Markets MOU supports Centers for children of migrant and farm workers - \$750,000.
- Unified Court Systems MOU supports Children's Centers - \$150,000.

Advantage After School Program: Approximately 16,400 children and youth may be served through 136 contracts with 190 program sites - \$28 million.

Empire State After School Program: Approximately 31,000 children and youth may be served through 69 contracts with approximately 296 program sites - \$52.1 million

- **DCC=Day Care Center** – provide care to an enrolled group of 7 or more children at a facility other than a personal residence. Maximum capacity is driven by square footage allowance.
- **FDC=Family Day Care Home** – provide care to more than 2 non-relative children in a residence. Max. capacity: 8 children / caregiver.
- **GFDC=Group Family Day Care Home** – provide care to more than 2 non-relative children in a residence. Maximum capacity: 16 children / 2 caregivers.
- **SACC=School Age Child Care** – provide care to an enrolled group of 7 or more children in a non-residence facility outside normal school hours. Maximum capacity is driven by square footage allowance.
- **LE=Legally Exempt Enrolled** - providers of subsidized child care services, who are not required to be licensed or registered, but who meet minimum health and safety standards required for enrollment.
