Dear Ms. Molnar:

The Cayuga County Department of Health and Human Services is requesting to amend its Child and Family Services 2010 Annual Plan Update. The Cayuga County Department of Health and Human Services is proposing to amend the way in which cases are opened or closed when there are not sufficient funds to maintain the current caseload or to open all eligible cases. Below are the proposed changes. If approved, the changes would be effective September 1, 2010.

Cases would be closed in the following order:

- Working families with income between 191-200% SIS
- Working families with income between 181-190% SIS
- Working families with income between 171-180% SIS
- Working families with income between 161-170% SIS
- Families participating in an approved training program with income at or below 160% SIS
- Emergency of short duration with income at or below 160% SIS
- Participating in an approved substance abuse program with income at or below 160% SIS
- NYS high school equivalency program with income at or below 160% SIS
- Actively seeking employment with income at or below 160% SIS
- Working families with income between 151-160% SIS
- Open CPS case to protect the child
- Families who have children with special needs
- Working families with income between 141-150% SIS
- Working families with income between 131-140% SIS
- Working families with income between 121-130% SIS
- Working families with income between 111-120% SIS
- Working families with income between 100-110% SIS



CNN hires Spitzer, Parker to co-host new show

NEW YORK — CNN is pairing former New York Gov. Eliot Spitzer and conservative columnist Kathleen Parker for a combative new prime-time program it insists won't be the second coming of "Crossfire."

The network is hoping for twin comebacks: for its own struggling nightly line-up and for the former Democratic governor who resigned in disgrace following a prostitution scandal. The new show will replace one hosted by Campbell Brown at 8 p.m. EDT, going against Bill


O'Reilly at Fox News Channel and Keith Olbermann at MSNBC, the top personalities at CNN's competitors.

The two said they'll discuss the type of issues heard around the kitchen table at dinner, "minus the cocktails," Parker said.


Spitzer said he and Park-
