Annual Report on the Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program Program Year 2018-2019

Pursuant to Executive Law § 529-b (5)

Prepared by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services'
Division of Youth Development and Partnerships for Success

Introduction

The supervision and treatment services for juveniles program (STSJP) is a key component of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo's vision to transform New York State's youth justice system. STSJP provides funding to municipalities (counties and New York City) for programs and services that fall within five service domains: Prevention, Early Intervention, Alternatives to Detention, Alternatives to Placement, and Reentry/Aftercare. All these services are intended to divert the following types of youth from placement or replacement in detention or residential care and to safely maintain youth in the community pending a family court disposition or conviction in criminal court:

- Youth who are alleged to be or adjudicated as Persons in Need of Supervision (PINS)
- Youth who are at risk of becoming, alleged to be, or adjudicated as Juvenile Delinquents (JDs)
- Youth who are alleged to be or convicted as Juvenile Offenders (JOs), Adolescent Offenders (AOs), or Youthful Offenders (YOs)

The program provides fiscal incentives to localities to reduce their use of pre-adjudication detention by allowing movement of unused detention allocation dollars, reimbursed at 49 percent by the state, into STSJP funds which is reimbursed at 62 percent by the state.

Raise the Age

New York State raised the age of criminal responsibility from 16 to 18 with the 2017 enactment of the Raise the Age (RTA) legislation. RTA was phased in over a two-year period, raising the age of criminal responsibility from age 16 to 17 on October 1, 2018, and subsequently raising the age from 17 to 18 on October 1, 2019. RTA allows all youth who have been arrested to be addressed in developmentally appropriate ways that promote accountability and safety.

The goals of RTA include providing more rehabilitative services for young offenders, reducing recidivism, and protecting teens from potentially traumatic or violent encounters in adult jails and prisons. The RTA legislation expanded the types of youth eligible for STSJP services to AOs and YOs and created an additional RTA allocation to support eligible localities in funding the incremental costs related to implementing RTA.


New York State Detention and Placement Trends

Detention

As New York State has strategically focused on juvenile justice reform efforts statewide, and municipalities have focused both locally and regionally on such reform efforts, there have been dramatic declines in the number of youth placed out of home. This has resulted in a 37 percent decrease in detention admissions for Rest of State (non-New York City) (ROS). Figures 1 and 2 show the detention admission trends by region and by adjudication type from 2015-2019.¹ Figure 1 shows a steady decline in New York State detention admissions between 2015 and 2018 (38 percent). The increase that occurred in 2019 coincides with the first full year of RTA implementation for 16-year-old youth and the beginning of RTA implementation for 17 year olds.

¹This counts detention admissions/episodes. During a calendar year, a youth could have multiple admissions/episodes. An episode is defined as a continuous stay where the detention type (JD/JO vs. PINS) is the same.

► **Figure 1. Detention Admissions Overview**





Historically, 16 and 17 year olds were remanded to county jail. Following RTA, it was anticipated that these youth would begin to appear in the New York State Office of Children and Family Services' (OCFS)'s detention numbers. This upward trend in detention admissions can be seen in Figure 2 for youth types associated with RTA (i.e., AOs and some JDs who started as AOs in the Youth Part of the superior court but had their cases removed to Family Court).

Placement

There was a 52 percent reduction in JD placements between 2014 and 2018 statewide, with a 73 percent reduction in JD placements during the same time period in New York City.² PINS petition filings declined by nearly 40 percent over the past five years (2014-2018) in both New York City and ROS, while PINS placements have decreased by 45 percent in ROS and 82 percent in NYC.³

The collective impact across the juvenile justice system is correlated with the strategic and simultaneous efforts at the local, regional and state levels. STSJP has been one collaborative strategy that has consistently contributed to these reductions.

Providing STSJP Services

A municipality electing to provide services with STSJP funds must submit a plan to OCFS for approval. STSJP plans must include the name of each service and program proposed for funding, the communities and types of youth targeted for the service/program, a description of the projected number of youth to be served, and how the program will result in the reduction of detention and placement of youth as well as other positive youth outcomes. Municipalities are asked to use previous STSJP programming data and historical detention and placement data provided by OCFS to identify communities and subpopulations of youth to target for supervision and treatment services.

Once a submitted STSJP plan is reviewed and approval is granted, the municipality is eligible to receive 62 percent state reimbursement for the cost of allowable STSJP expenditures up to the municipality's STSJP allocation cap, which is set through an allocation methodology determined by OCFS. A municipality that elects to provide additional STSJP services may choose to shift part of its available detention allocation to be used for STSJP. Shifted funds spent on STSJP-eligible expenditures receive 62 percent state reimbursement as opposed to the 49 percent state reimbursement for eligible detention services expenditures.

Municipalities looking to create new or expand existing STSJP programs to serve Raise the Age (RTA) youth, and request 100 percent state reimbursement for this programming, must include those costs in their comprehensive RTA plan, as with other expenditures attendant to RTA. These new or expanded STSJP programs are denoted as STSJP-RTA and are reviewed in the context of the entirety of the municipality's comprehensive RTA plan to determine if the municipality is eligible for 100 percent state reimbursement. Such STSJP-RTA costs must be approved by the New York State Division of the Budget (DOB) and must also be reviewed and approved in the municipality's STSJP plan.

Program Year 2018-2019

Approved Programming

STSJP funding in the amount of \$8,376,000 was appropriated for New York State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2018-2019. An additional \$500,000 allotment was divided equally between six (6) municipalities (Albany, Erie, Monroe,

Onondaga, Nassau and Orange counties) to support continued coordination and implementation of the Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative (JDAI). JDAI is a national, system-reform initiative coordinated by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, with a primary goal of reducing the unnecessary and inappropriate use of detention without compromising public safety.

During SFY 2018-2019, 50 municipalities were approved to provide STSJP funded programs, of which 29 were approved to provide STSJP-RTA funded programs. Seven (7) municipalities did not submit 2018-19 STSJP plans (Chemung, Fulton, Greene, Montgomery, Ontario, Wayne and Yates counties). One (1) municipality (Orleans County) submitted a plan for STSJP-RTA funding only but rescinded the plan when it incurred no expenditures.

Appendix A– **2018-2019 STSJP, Detention and STSJP-RTA Funding by Municipality with Youth Served** outlines by municipality the STSJP and detention allocations, the approved detention allocation shifted to STSJP, STSJP funding disbursed, and the DOB-approved STSJP-RTA funding and STSJP-RTA funding disbursed. Also outlined are the number of youth served on a biannual basis for both STSJP and STSJP-RTA funded programs.

Figure 3 illustrates the number and percentage of STSJP and STSJP-RTA-funded services in 2018-2019. Please note that these numbers represent STSJP’s unique programs by funding stream, as one agency program may serve youth in multiple continuum service domains.




Program Data Collection


In 2016, OCFS began standardizing program-level data and introduced juvenile justice performance outcomes for the five service domains. Each program year, STSJ data are collected from funded localities during two reporting periods: Period I runs from October 1 through March 31 and Period II runs from April 1 to September 30.

Youth Served

Each period, municipalities report on the number of youth served in their programs for that period. Please note that the total number of youth served may include duplicate counts; youth could be counted more than once if they were served by one program, released from or exited the program, and then were admitted to the same or another program during the reporting period. It is also possible that youth served in Period I are reported again as youth served in Period II.


Reporting Period I. For the period of October 1, 2018, through March 31, 2019, 45 counties and New York City reported data on their STSJ programs. Statewide, these programs served a total of 4,498 youth. Just over half (51 percent) of all youth were served in alternative to placement (ATP) programs. An additional 20 percent were served in alternative to detention (ATD) programs. The remaining 29 percent of youth were served in programs that sought to mitigate their risk of system contact (prevention [P], early intervention [EI]), or support their needs as they transitioned home, following the deepest level of system involvement (reentry/aftercare [RA]).

Fourteen (non-NYC) counties also reported data on their STSJ-RTA programs for the first reporting period of the 2018-2019 program year. An additional 197 youth were served through these programs. Similar to STSJ programming, approximately three-quarters of STSJ-RTA programming served youth in the ATD and ATP domains; in contrast to STSP programming, slightly more youth were served in ATDs than ATPs. See Figure 5 for the distribution of youth served by domain in STSJ and STSJ-RTA-funded programs for the period.



Reporting Period II. For the period of April 1, 2019, to September 30, 2019, 45 counties and New York City reported data on their STSJ programs. Statewide, these programs served 4,617 youth. The distribution of youth served remained fairly consistent with what was reported during the first period.

Fifteen (non-NYC) counties also reported data on their STSJ-RTA programs for the second half of the program year. An additional 360 youth were served in these programs. The distribution of youth served through STSJ-RTA-funded programs remained fairly consistent with what was reported during the first period. See Figure 6.

OCFS continues to work diligently with municipalities to ensure the submission of consistent and accurate data for STSJ programs. Biannual reporting by municipalities allows OCFS to provide relevant technical assistance and allows municipalities to assess the effectiveness of their funded programs during the program year.

NOTES

1 Program Type

STSJP funded programs receive State reimbursement for 62% of their total program costs. In 2017, the STSJP continuum was expanded to include the following direct service categories: Prevention, Early Intervention, Alternatives to Detention (ATD) for Juvenile Delinquents (JD), Juvenile Offenders (JO) and Persons in Need of Supervision (PINS), Alternatives to Placement (ATP), and Reentry/Aftercare Programming.

STSJP-RTA funded programs receive access to 100% State reimbursement for RTA-related expenditures under the Raise the Age legislation. In 2018, STSJP was expanded to include the following direct service categories under RTA funding: Prevention, Early Intervention, Alternatives to Detention (ATD) for Juvenile Delinquents (JD) and Adolescent Offenders (AO), Alternatives to Placement (ATP), and Reentry/Aftercare Programming. STSJP-RTA programs must be approved on the Municipality's RTA Fiscal Comprehensive Plan *and* the STSJP Annual Plan to be included in this section.

Indirect Services. STSJP and STSJP-RTA funds can also be used to provide indirect services. This report excludes indirect services (e.g., educational liaison, technical support, transportation, one-visit assessments) since those services do not target specific youth, or youth whose outcomes can be tracked during a continuous enrollment period.

2 Total Served

These numbers may include duplicate counts; youth could be counted more than once if they were served by one program, released, and then admitted to the same or another program during the reporting period.

3 Race

Counts may not sum to Total Served and percentages may not sum to 100% because multiple race selections are possible for each youth.

4 Average Age at Program Start

Data for this Monitoring Report come from the County Summary Sheets, which include program-level data rather than youth-level data. If the locality funded multiple programs of the same type (e.g., Prevention) during the reporting period, Average Age at Program Start was calculated by weighting the average reported for each program by the number of youth that program served.

5,6 Average Length of Service

Percentages are out of the number served presented in Table 1 for STSJP funded programs and Table 4 for STSJP-RTA funded programs.

Data for this Monitoring Report come from the County Summary Sheets, which include program-level data rather than youth-level data. If the locality funded multiple programs of the same type (e.g., Prevention) during the reporting period, Average Length of Service was calculated by weighting the average reported for each program by the number of youth that program released.

7 Program Involvement

"Attended at least 90% of all required program activities" is the only Program Involvement or Outcome item that includes an option for *Not Applicable (N/A)*. All other items include three options: *Yes*, *No*, and *Information Not Collected*. For the sake of simplicity, all *Information Not Collected* and *N/A* responses are included under Unknown for the purposes of this report.

8 Outcomes

Youth outcomes and program involvement are reported in the period coinciding with their exit from the program. Outcomes include events that occurred during program involvement (i.e., between a youth's Program Start Date and Program End Date).

NOTES

1 Program Type

STSJP funded programs receive State reimbursement for 62% of their total program costs. In 2017, the STSJP continuum was expanded to include the following direct service categories: Prevention, Early Intervention, Alternatives to Detention (ATD) for Juvenile Delinquents (JD), Juvenile Offenders (JO) and Persons in Need of Supervision (PINS), Alternatives to Placement (ATP), and Reentry/Aftercare Programming.

STSJP-RTA funded programs receive access to 100% State reimbursement for RTA-related expenditures under the Raise the Age legislation. In 2018, STSJP was expanded to include the following direct service categories under RTA funding: Prevention, Early Intervention, Alternatives to Detention (ATD) for Juvenile Delinquents (JD) and Adolescent Offenders (AO), Alternatives to Placement (ATP), and Reentry/Aftercare Programming. STSJP-RTA programs must be approved on the Municipality's RTA Fiscal Comprehensive Plan *and* the STSJP Annual Plan to be included in this section.

Indirect Services. STSJP and STSJP-RTA funds can also be used to provide indirect services. This report excludes indirect services (e.g., educational liaison, technical support, transportation, one-visit assessments) since those services do not target specific youth, or youth whose outcomes can be tracked during a continuous enrollment period.

2 Total Served

These numbers may include duplicate counts; youth could be counted more than once if they were served by one program, released, and then admitted to the same or another program during the reporting period.

3 Race

Counts may not sum to Total Served and percentages may not sum to 100% because multiple race selections are possible for each youth.

4 Average Age at Program Start

Data for this Monitoring Report come from the County Summary Sheets, which include program-level data rather than youth-level data. If the locality funded multiple programs of the same type (e.g., Prevention) during the reporting period, Average Age at Program Start was calculated by weighting the average reported for each program by the number of youth that program served.

5,6 Average Length of Service

Percentages are out of the number served presented in Table 1 for STSJP funded programs and Table 4 for STSJP-RTA funded programs.

Data for this Monitoring Report come from the County Summary Sheets, which include program-level data rather than youth-level data. If the locality funded multiple programs of the same type (e.g., Prevention) during the reporting period, Average Length of Service was calculated by weighting the average reported for each program by the number of youth that program released.

7 Program Involvement

"Attended at least 90% of all required program activities" is the only Program Involvement or Outcome item that includes an option for *Not Applicable (N/A)*. All other items include three options: *Yes*, *No*, and *Information Not Collected*. For the sake of simplicity, all *Information Not Collected* and *N/A* responses are included under Unknown for the purposes of this report.

8 Outcomes

Youth outcomes and program involvement are reported in the period coinciding with their exit from the program. Outcomes include events that occurred during program involvement (i.e., between a youth's Program Start Date and Program End Date).
