This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:

- A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
- The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
- The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
- The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child’s family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child’s death; whether the child or the child’s family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child’s death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child’s death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child’s household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may **only** be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. **It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child’s siblings or other children in the household.**

OCFS’ review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS’ assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

On 8/3/2022, the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS) learned of the death of the 5-year-old female subject child that occurred on the same date. The family had an open Preventive Services Case at the time of her death. ACS notified the New York City Regional Office via the OCFS 7065 Agency Reporting Form.

Executive Summary

On 8/3/22, ACS received notification that the 5-year-old child died due to a fire in her home on the same date. ACS had an open services case since 3/23/21, involving the father and child. At the time of the child's death the father was under an Order of Supervision through family court. ACS filed a Neglect Petition against the father in 2021 due to concerns of substance misuse and excessive corporal punishment. The mother of the child resided outside of the home and had supervised visits with the child.

On 8/3/22, at approximately 3:00AM, a fire started in the home and the child and father's girlfriend died as a result. The father was able to get out of the apartment, but suffered significant burns to his body after trying to get the child and his girlfriend out of the fire. The father's girlfriend did not reside in the home, but did occasionally spend the night. Following the fire, the father was hospitalized and was unable to be interviewed regarding the incident. ACS gathered information from the Medical Examiner. It was reported the child appeared well cared for. The only injuries to the child associated with the child's death were fire related. The cause of death was determined to be thermal and smoke inhalation from fire.

ACS appeared in court on 8/5/22, and the Court Ordered Supervision was terminated, as there were no surviving siblings or children in the home. ACS offered assistance with burial expenses and provided the family with information on grief counseling. ACS closed the services case on 8/9/22.

LDSS Response

On 8/3/22, ACS conducted a routine telephone call to the mother and was informed of the subject child's passing. ACS gathered information from the Medical Examiner, spoke to family members and neighbors, and documented information learned from news articles.

The family had an open Preventive Services Case at the time of the child's death. The child was at the home with the father and his girlfriend when a fire started at the apartment. It was presumed the family was sleeping when the fire began. The father got out of the apartment, and according to collateral sources, attempted to reenter the apartment to retrieve the child and his girlfriend. The father was not able to get them out and in attempting to, sustained burns to his body. As a result of the burns, the father was hospitalized and remained in the hospital at the time the services case was closed. The father was not able to be interviewed by ACS regarding the incident; however, the father provided some information to law enforcement upon their arrival to the fire, and ACS retrieved those records. The father reported to law enforcement that his electric scooter caught on fire inside his apartment. The investigation into the fire was ongoing.

Based on the information gathered, ACS determined the child's death was the result of the fire and not due to abuse or maltreatment by a caretaker. Family members were provided with information on grief counseling services. The funeral was being arranged by a relative, and the father's insurance was covering the cost.

Report Summary:
An SCR report alleged that the subject child was touched in an inappropriate sexual manner by the father. In addition, the report alleged that the child was not bathed consistently by the father, which resulted in hygiene issues.

Report Determination: Unfounded **Date of Determination:** 03/07/2022

Basis for Determination:
The allegations of Inadequate Guardianship and Sexual Abuse against the father regarding the subject child were unsubstantiated. The subject child was medically examined at the hospital and there were no suspicions or inclinations of sexual abuse or poor hygiene.

OCFS Review Results:
ACS initiated a joint interview with law enforcement, and notified the District Attorney of the SCR report. The child was interviewed at the Child Advocacy Center and did not make any disclosures. ACS interviewed the now adult sibling and his mother and completed a visit to their home. There was an attempted phone call made to the mother on 1/18/22; however, the record did not reflect diligent efforts to interview her. ACS made contact with several collateral sources regarding the care of the now adult sibling and subject child. The father was minimally cooperative with CPS and the father's long term worker was made aware of the concerns.

Report Summary:

An SCR report alleged that on 3/21/21, the BF was intoxicated and physically assaulted the then 16yo SS. The BF punched the SS multiple times for unknown reasons. The SS sustained bruises to his neck and chest area. The BF had a history of physically assaulting the SS's BM. After the incident on 3/21/21, the SS left the BF's home and went to his mothers. The BF went to the SS's mother's home, banged on the door causing damage, and made threats to physically harm the SS and his BM. On 3/26/21 and 3/28/21, subsequent reports were received, in which the SC was also listed as maltreated due to the BF hitting the SC while impaired and not making a plan for the SC when he got arrested.

Report Determination: Indicated

Date of Determination: 05/18/2021

Basis for Determination:

The allegations of Inadequate Guardianship, Lacerations, Bruises and Welt, and Parents Drugs/Alcohol Misuse against the father in regards to the SS and SC were substantiated. It was determined through casework and collateral contacts that the father assaulted the SS while intoxicated. The father was arrested during the investigation and did not make a plan for the child, which resulted in her temporary placement at a children's center.

OCFS Review Results:

ACS completed home visits and interviews and assessed the safety of the children. ACS filed an Article 10 Neglect Petition against the father regarding the SS and he was released to the custody of his mother with an Order of Protection against the father. When subsequent reports were received alleging maltreatment of the SC, ACS amended their Neglect Petition to include the SC. The SC was released to the father's care and the father was ordered to complete services. ACS opened a preventive services case to monitor the required services and made referrals as necessary.

Preventive Services History

On 9/12/16, the mother gave birth to the child. The mother had significant history with ACS, which included the removal of her other children, who have since been freed for adoption. After the child's birth, ACS completed a safety conference on 09/15/16. The mother was asked to leave the home and child remained in the home with the father. On 3/12/18, the order expired and ACS did not request an extension, as the mother completed services. The mother reported the father kicked her out of the home and the child remained with him at the time the court order expired and the family was no longer involved with CPS.

Following an incident with the now adult sibling in March 2021, ACS filed a Neglect Petition against the father regarding the now adult sibling and child. The child was temporarily removed from the father, but was returned on 4/1/21 with Court Ordered Supervision. The father was court ordered to complete a substance abuse treatment evaluation, participate in random drug screens, and engage in anger management and parenting classes. The father was not cooperative with service providers and did not participate in his court ordered services. There was court on 6/5/22, and the father's court ordered supervision was extended until 6/5/23. On 8/5/22, the father's Preventive Services Case was closed, as there were no surviving children in his home.

The child was removed from the father's care on 3/28/21. The child was returned to the father in court on 4/1/21, and the father was ordered to engage in preventive services.

Comments:	On 3/26/21, ACS filed a Neglect Petition against the father regarding the now adult sibling. The adult sibling was released to the care of his mother. On 3/28/21, an emergency removal of the subject child was conducted. ACS amended the Neglect Petition against the father to include the child.
