This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:

- A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
- The death of a child for whom child protective services had an open investigation or a CPS monitored services case.
- The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
- The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child’s family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child’s death; whether the child or the child’s family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child’s death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child’s death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child’s household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may **only** be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. **It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child’s siblings or other children in the household.**

OCFS’ review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS’ assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report was received on 5/28/23 and alleged on 5/13/23, the 3-month-old female child started to cry. The father was overwhelmed with her crying, he picked her up, shook her and slapped her. After he put her down, the parents went to bed and woke around 9:00AM. At that time, the parents noticed the child was not breathing, her skin was blue, and she was cold. The mother was also present during the incident and failed to intervene. When the father realized that she was no longer alive, he put her in a bag and disposed of her at an unknown location. At the time of the infant's death, she had subdural bleeding in her head. In addition, at some point prior to the date of her death, the infant's ribs were fractured.

Executive Summary

On 5/28/23, the Administration for Children's Services (ACS) received two SCR reports regarding the death of the 3-month-old female child. The reports contained allegations of DOA/Fatality, Fractures, Lack of Medical Care and Inadequate Guardianship against the mother and father. In addition, allegations of Chocking/Twisting/Shaking and Internal Injuries were listed against the father. At the time of the fatality, the child resided at a shelter with her mother and father. ACS immediately initiated their investigation and learned there were no surviving siblings.

Through a joint investigation with law enforcement, it was learned in the evening on 5/13/23, the 3-month-old child was crying and unable to be consoled by the parents. The father picked her up and began to aggressively shake her. The child stopped crying and was then placed in her crib while the mother and father went to sleep. On 5/14/23, the mother and father woke and observed the child was cold, and unresponsive. On 5/28/23, the child's remains were found by an expressway.

ACS communicated with law enforcement and the assistant district attorney and learned the father was indicted on the following charges, Murder in the Second Degree, Manslaughter in the First Degree and Manslaughter in the Second Degree. In addition, the mother and father were indicted regarding the following charges, Tampering with Physical Evidence, Concealment of a Human Corpse and Obstructing Governmental Administration in the Second Degree. At the time this report was written, the father was incarcerated, the mother was on supervised release with an ankle monitor and the criminal cases were still pending.

Contact with the Medical Examiner's Office revealed the cause of death had not yet been determined; however, was consistent with what the father had reported regarding shaking the child. The medical examiner was unable to determine if the child had marks or bruises at the time of her death as her body was not discovered for two weeks. The medical exam showed she had broken ribs and was determined to be an old injury. The child appeared to be well nourished and was free of any illness.

The allegations of DOA/Fatality, Fractures, Lack of Medical Care, and Inadequate Guardianship were substantiated against the mother and father. Additional allegations of Chocking/Twisting/Shaking and Internal Injuries were substantiated against the father. ACS found there was a fair preponderance of evidence to support the above allegations and the case was closed on 7/26/23. The record reflected ACS completed their investigation, required reports and safety assessments timely and accurately.

ACS communicated with collateral contacts such as the shelter staff, law enforcement the medical examiner, assistant



district attorney and the paternal grandmother and grandfather. ACS offered the father bereavement services which he declined. The mother was provided a referral for bereavement services, but it remained unknown if she engaged in services.

LDSS Response

Upon receipt of the initial SCR report on 5/28/23, ACS initiated their investigation within 24 hours, coordinated their efforts with LE, spoke to the sources of the reports, and corresponded with the district attorney and medical examiner regarding the fatality.

ACS communicated with LE and informed them the SM and SF were claiming they moved out of state and the SC was currently in their care. Out of state LE attempted to conduct a wellness check; however, the address provided by the parents was an empty plot of land. LE in NY obtained contact information for the parents from ACS and found their location which was in NY. The parents were immediately taken into custody.

LE interviewed the SF and SM without ACS. Per LE, the SF confessed he murdered the SC and provided LE locating information for where the SC's remains were discarded. During his interview, the SF explained on 5/13/23, just prior to midnight, he was attempting to put the SC to sleep and placed her in her crib in hopes she would cry herself to sleep. The SC continued to cry and around 1AM, the SF grabbed the SC by the back of her neck and shook her up and down while also choking her. The SF also reported hitting the SC on her buttocks and slapping her across the face. The SC then stopped crying and became unresponsive. When asked about the SM, LE advised she requested an attorney and did not speak.

ACS spoke with the SF via video-conference due to him being incarcerated. During his interview, he did not provide additional information regarding the fatality. The SF stated he had MH diagnoses and did not bond with the SC. At the time of the fatality, the father was not participating in mental health treatment. Regarding the rib injury, the SF confirmed weeks prior to the death, he was bathing the SC and dropped her. He explained he did not initially think the SC was injured; however, when he pressed on her stomach, she appeared to be in pain. The SF denied obtaining medical care for the SC reporting he was scared because he had warrants for his arrest.

ACS spoke with the SM regarding the incident on 5/13/23. During her interview, the SM explained the SF was becoming



agitated due to the SC continuously crying. The SM reported attempting to calm the SC by feeding her a bottle and giving her a bath, but nothing worked. She explained the SF began “bugging out” on the SC and she attempted to calm him down, but he did not, so she then left the room putting her headphones on until the SC stopped crying. The SM then went to check on the SC and reported the SC looked like she was sleeping. Around 4AM, the SC did not wake for her normal feeding and she and the SF checked on the SC noticing she was deceased. She explained wanting to get the SC help, but the SF refused as she had scratches and bruises around her neck. The parents then changed the SC’s diaper, put her in a brown onesie and then into the stroller. In addition, the parents grabbed a black garbage bag and bookbag and then left the shelter. The SM placed the SC in the bookbag and then placed the bookbag in the black garbage bag and threw out the stroller. The parents stayed at the shelter for a few more days and left due to fearing the staff would notice the SC was not with them. Regarding the SC's rib injury, the SM stated she dropped her when lifting her out of the bathtub and did not get the child medical attention.

ACS spoke with shelter staff who explained on 5/14/23, at 8:54AM, the SM and SC were seen leaving the shelter and staff were unable to verify if the SC was alive. The SM was seen returning to the shelter on that same date without the SC. On 5/16/23, the SM and SF moved out of the shelter.

ACS spoke with the PGF who reported the SF confessed to him about the incident regarding the SC. The PGF explained the SF has a history of poor mental health and had added stressors due to being unemployed. He denied any concerns for DV or substance abuse.
