This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report was received 2/17/19, which alleged the subject child (one month old) died while in the care of his mother and father. The child was otherwise healthy; therefore, his death was suspicious. The roles of the 6-year-old and 2-year-old siblings were unknown.

Executive Summary

Monroe County Department of Human Services (MCDHS) received a report from the SCR on 2/17/19, concerning the death of the 1-month-old. The child died while sleeping in bed with his mother. He was an otherwise healthy child, which made the death suspicious in nature.

During the investigation, information was reported from the mother that around 1am the child was especially fussy. The mother took the child out of his bassinet and placed him on her chest in an attempt to get the child to settle. The mother reported she must have fallen asleep with him on her chest because when she woke in the morning around 4am he was against her back, unresponsive and not breathing. Both parents called 911 from separate phones. The child was transported by EMS to Strong Hospital where he expired at 5:22am. An autopsy was completed, but the results were pending at the time of this writing.

The mother and father resided together with the infant and surviving siblings (ages 6 and 2 years). The father had been sleeping in a different bed with the other two children at the time of the fatal incident. MCDHS assessed the safety of the siblings immediately. A safety plan was not necessary as the siblings were observed to be safe in the home with the parents and the same concerns for an unsafe sleep environment did not apply to these children due to their ages/levels of development. Both the maternal and the paternal grandparents agreed to help support the family during the grieving period.

MCDHS completed a joint investigation with Rochester Police Department and no criminal charges were filed.

MCDHS contacted all necessary collaterals and determined there was credible evidence to substantiate the allegation of inadequate guardianship against both parents. MCDHS determined the parents were not appropriate in supplying the child with a safe sleep environment in addition to aggravating factors being present (the mother's position to the child, pillows, and blankets). MCDHS determined that there was not credible evidence to substantiate the allegation of DOA/Fatality against the parents because the final autopsy was pending at the time the investigation was concluded and the Rochester Police Department did not pursue criminal charges. The parents were agreeable to preventive services and began actively participating with Family Trauma Intervention Program (FTIP) through the Society for the Protection and Care of Children (SPCC).

LDSS Response

MCDHS received the report regarding death of the 1-month-old child who was an otherwise healthy infant. MCDHS initiated the investigation immediately and assessed the safety of the surviving siblings within 24 hours of receipt of the report. MCDHS reviewed SCR history, spoke to the source, LE and DA's office, and met with the family.

Through interviews conducted with family members, it was learned the day leading up to the death was uneventful. The family went to sleep around 12:30am and all family members slept in the same room. The infant child slept in a bassinet, which the mother placed on her bed. The father, 6-year-old, and 2-year-old siblings slept on what was described as a black mat next to the mother's bed, but lower to the ground. The father recalled seeing the infant in his bassinet when they all went to bed. The mother said the child was more fussy than normal and she took him out of his bassinet around 1:30am and placed him on her chest as that usually settles him. The mother reported this was not a typical sleeping arrangement for the child as he usually slept in the bassinet. When the mother woke around 4am, she did not see the child in his bassinet and felt him pressed into her back with his face against the side of her body. The mother screamed for the father and both called 911. The father was interviewed at the hospital and was not aware the mother put the child into bed with her. The father reported he had no previous concerns for the mother's care of the children. The parents received safe sleep education prior to the child's death. Both parents reported having an alcoholic beverage the evening prior to the child's death, but denied intoxication. There was no evidence that either parent was under the influence of drugs or alcohol at the time of the child's death.



In speaking with the 6-year-old sibling, concerns arose regarding domestic violence between the parents. Specifically, the sibling said he had witnessed his father physically assault his mother and injure her hand. These concerns were addressed with the parents. Though the parents denied recent domestic violence, they admitted the father had physically assaulted the mother in the past and were open to services related to domestic violence.

Information was received from Strong Memorial Hospital where the infant was transported following the incident. Records showed the infant was pronounced deceased at 5:22am following co-sleeping in bed with the mother. Both parents called 911 at approximately 4:17am, and began CPR until emergency medical services arrived.

MCDHS accurately determined the allegations after conducting a thorough investigation. The safety and risk assessments were fitting to the case circumstances. The parents were offered services through the Society for the Protection and Care of Children and were actively engaged in services at the time of this writing.
