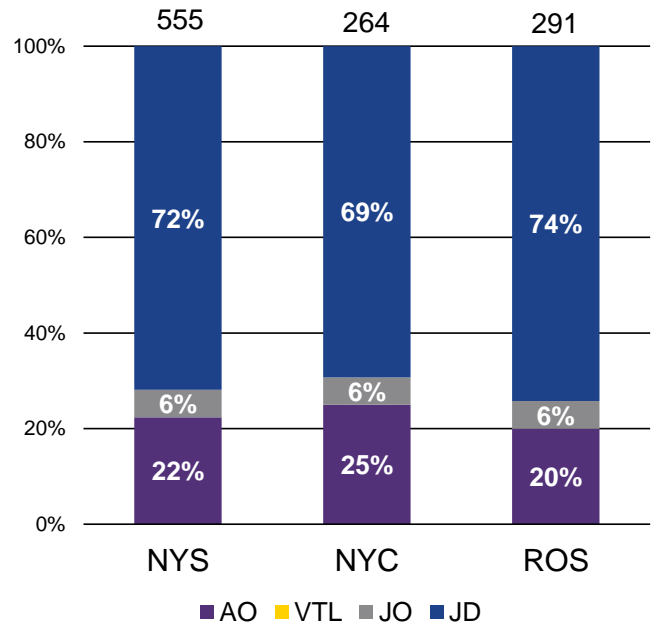
Result Summary

Admissions

In Q1 2021 (January 1, 2021 - March 31, 2021), a total of 555 detention admissions occurred across the state. As shown in Table 1, New York City (NYC) accounted for 48% (264) of those admissions, while the 57 non-NYC counties—which this report refers to as Rest of State (ROS)—accounted for 52% (291).

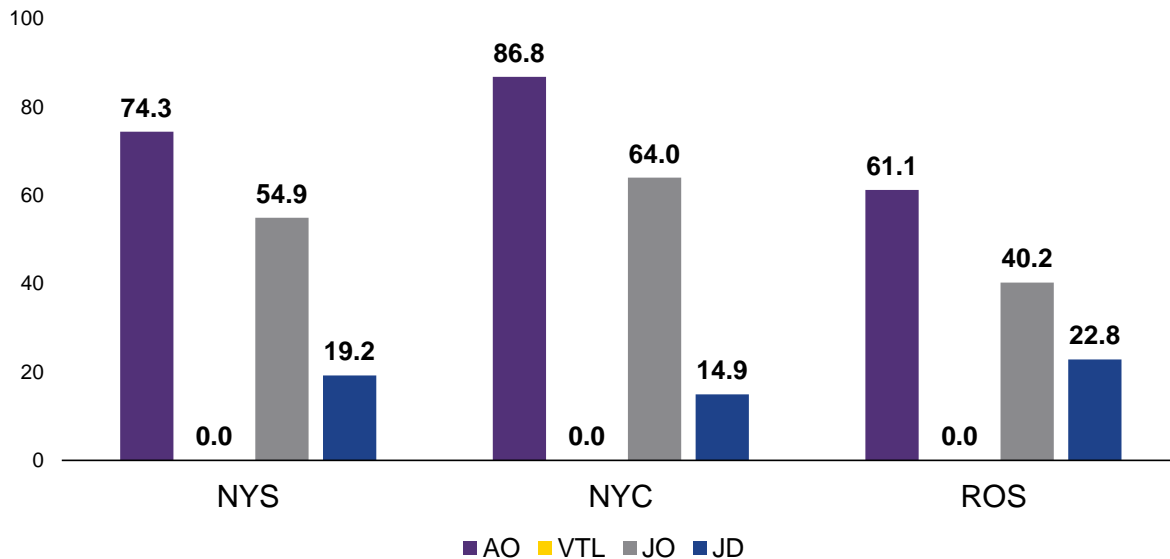
► **Figure 1. Admissions by Case Type**

In New York State (NYS), youth can be detained in relation to Adolescent Offender (AO), Vehicle and Traffic Law (VTL) Misdemeanor, Juvenile Offender (JO), and Juvenile Delinquency (JD) cases. Statewide, admissions on JD matters were most common (72%), followed by AO (22%), JO (6%), and VTL (0%) related events. This pattern was consistent for both NYC and ROS (see Figure 1).

Average Length of Stay

While admissions data are helpful for understanding how often detention occurs and for what types of cases, not all detention admissions result in similar lengths of stay. As shown in Table 4, average length of stay (ALOS) varies widely by case type. Statewide, in Q1 2021, AOs had the longest ALOS (74.3 days), followed by JOs (54.9 days), and JDs (19.2 days). This pattern was consistent for both NYC and ROS (see Figure 2).

Result Summary

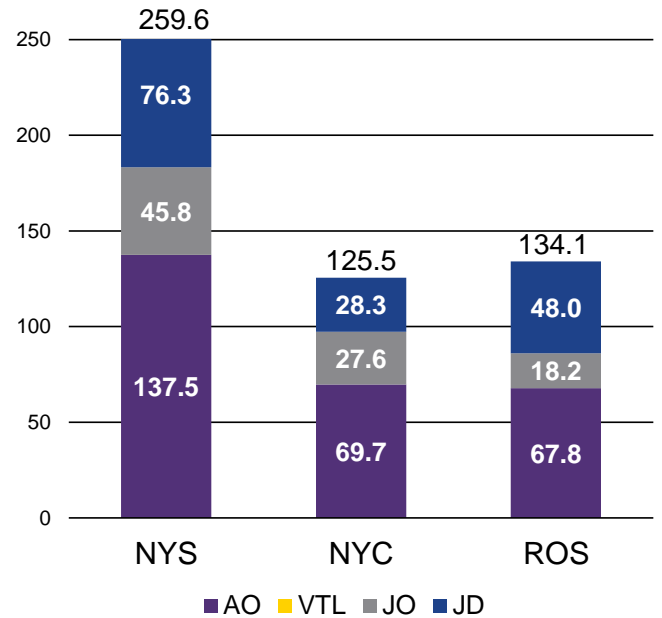
Average Daily Population

Since lengths of stay vary, average daily population (ADP) is a helpful indicator for summarizing the amount of detention resources used during a given period. ADP is a function of how many youth are admitted and how long each youth stays. It's calculated by dividing the total care days provided for a specified period by the number of days in that period. It can be interpreted as the average or mean number of youth in detention on any given day.

In Q1 2021, New York State's detention facilities served an average of 259.6 youth on any given day—125.5 (48%) in NYC and 134.1 (52%) in ROS (see Table 7). AOs accounted for the largest part of the statewide ADP (137.5), followed by JDs (76.3), and JOs (45.8).

As shown in Figure 3, AOs accounted for the largest part of both NYC and ROS's ADPs, followed by JDs and JOs.

► **Figure 3. ADP by Case Type**

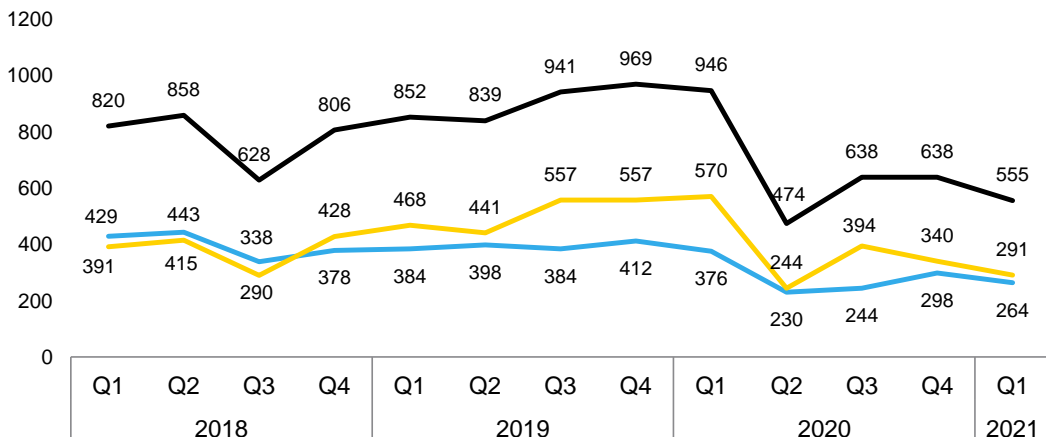


Admission Trends

As shown in Table 10 and Figure 4, in comparison to last quarter, detention admissions are down 13% statewide. Admissions decreased from 638 in Q4 2020 to 555 in Q1 2021. Both NYC (-11%) and ROS (-14%) experienced a decrease.

Admissions are also down (-41%) when compared to this quarter last year. Statewide, admissions decreased from 946 in Q1 2020 to 555 in Q1 2021. This decrease was driven by both NYC and ROS. In comparison to this quarter last year, NYC's admissions are down 30%, while ROS's admissions are down 49%.

Notes

¹ **Admissions** – A count of admissions to detention that occurred during the quarter. For a detention event to be counted, admission date must be on or after the first day of the quarter and on or before the last day of the quarter. A single youth can have multiple admissions during a quarter.

² **Case Type** – Indicates whether a youth was admitted as an Adolescent Offender (AO), Vehicle Traffic Law (VTL) Misdemeanant, Juvenile Offender (JO) or Juvenile Delinquent (JD):

Adolescent Offender (AO) – An Adolescent Offender is a person 16 years of age charged with a felony on or after October 1, 2018 and a person 17 years of age charged with a felony on or after October 1, 2019 (CPL 1.20 (44)). AO cases are heard in the Youth Part of adult Criminal Court; however, they may be removed to Family Court for processing (CPL 722.23). Adolescent Offenders whose cases are removed to Family Court are treated as Juvenile Delinquents.

Vehicle Traffic Law (VTL) Misdemeanant – A VTL Misdemeanant is a person 16 years of age charged with a misdemeanor under the Vehicle and Traffic Law on or after October 1, 2018 and a person 17 years of age charged with a misdemeanor under the Vehicle and Traffic Law on or after October 1, 2019. Although these cases are heard in local Criminal Court, VTL Misdemeanants sentenced to a term of imprisonment before age 21 are served in Specialized Secure Detention (SSD) facilities (PEN 70.20 (4)(a-2)).

Juvenile Offender (JO) – A Juvenile Offender is a person 13 to 15 years of age charged with a serious violent felony pursuant to Section 1.20(42) of the NYS Criminal Procedure Law (CPL). JO cases are heard in the Youth Part of adult Criminal Court.

Juvenile Delinquent (JD) – A Juvenile Delinquent is a person 7 to 15 years of age who has committed an act which would be considered a crime if the person were old enough and capable of being treated as an adult. Sixteen year olds charged with a misdemeanor (except those charged under the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law) on or after October 1, 2018 and 17 year olds charged with a misdemeanor (except those charged under the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law) on or after October 1, 2019 are also Juvenile Delinquents (FCT 301.2(1)). JD cases are heard in Family Court.

³ **New York City (NYC)** – All NYC numbers exclude youth served at Horizon, the Specialized Secure Detention (SSD) facility currently designated to serve youth under the age of 18 who can no longer be housed at Rikers.

⁴ **Unsentenced vs. Sentenced** – This report breaks out Adolescent Offenders into two groups: Unsentenced and Sentenced. Specialized Secure Detention (SSD) facilities provide pre-trial detention services for Unsentenced AOs and post-conviction incarceration programs for Sentenced AOs.

Adolescent Offenders who receive a definite sentence of one year or less before age 21 can serve their sentence in either a Specialized Secure Detention facility or an OCFS Secure placement facility (PEN 70.20 (4)(a)). The figures provided in this report do not include AOs serving their sentences in OCFS Secure.

⁵ **Non-Raise the Age vs. Raise the Age** – This report breaks out Juvenile Delinquents into two groups: Non-Raise the Age and Raise the Age. The Non-Raise the Age category includes JDs who were 7 to 15 years of age at offense, while the Raise the Age category includes 16 and 17 year old JD misdemeanants who went directly to Family Court and former AOs whose cases were transferred from the Youth Part.

If a JD is missing his/her Date of Offense in the Juvenile Detention Automated System (JDAS), he/she is counted as Non-Raise the Age for the purposes of this report.

Notes

⁶ **Average Length of Stay (ALOS)** – ALOS in days is calculated for released youth only. If no youth were released during the quarter a dash appears. ALOS is calculated by summing the lengths of stay for the released youth and dividing the total by the number of releases.

Note: Length of Stay (LOS) is determined by subtracting a youth's admission date from his/her release date. In the rare case that a youth is admitted and released on the same date, his/her LOS is set to one.

⁷ **Average Daily Population (ADP)** – The average (mean) number of youth in detention on any given day during the quarter. ADP is the sum of each youth's days in detention during the quarter (including day of admission but excluding day of release), divided by the number of days during the quarter.

⁸ **This Quarter** – This column shows the number of admissions that occurred during the current quarter.

⁹ **Last Quarter** – This column shows the number of admissions that occurred during the previous quarter. For example, if the current quarter was Q2 2018, this column would show the number of admissions that occurred Q1 2018.

¹⁰ **This Quarter Last Year** – This column shows the number of admissions that occurred this quarter last year. For example, if the current quarter was Q2 2018, this column would show the number of admissions that occurred Q2 2017.

¹¹ **% Change Since Last Quarter** – This column shows the percent change in admissions from last quarter to the current quarter. This percentage is calculated using the following formula:
$$\left(\frac{\text{This Quarter} - \text{Last Quarter}}{\text{Last Quarter}}\right) * 100$$

¹² **% Change Since This Quarter Last Year** – This column shows the percent change in admissions from this quarter last year to the current quarter. This percentage is calculated using the following formula:
$$\left(\frac{\text{This Quarter} - \text{This Quarter Last Year}}{\text{This Quarter Last Year}}\right) * 100$$

Unit of Observation

This report includes counts of detention events—**not** the number of unique youth detained. A detention event is defined as a continuous detention stay that does not involve a change in Case Type (see Note 2) or Home County. A stay concludes when there is a break in detention of one or more days, or a change in Case Type or Home County. A single youth can have multiple detention events/stays during the quarter.

Please note that this report excludes all detention events involving Interstate and Out-of-State youth.
