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Note: Governor Cuomo's "Close to Home" initiative went into effect on September 1, 2012. At this time, OCFS: 1) began transferring youth in care in non-secure facilities and voluntary agencies into the care and custody of New York City's Administration for Children's Services, and 2) ceased admitting newly placed non-secure youth into the care and custody of OCFS. In December 2015, OCFS ceased admitting newly placed limited secure youth into its care and custody. Therefore, numbers from the 2012-2017 reports for New York City youth in non-secure and voluntary agency settings, and 2016-2017 reports for NYC youth in limited secure settings, are not comparable to those from previous years.
