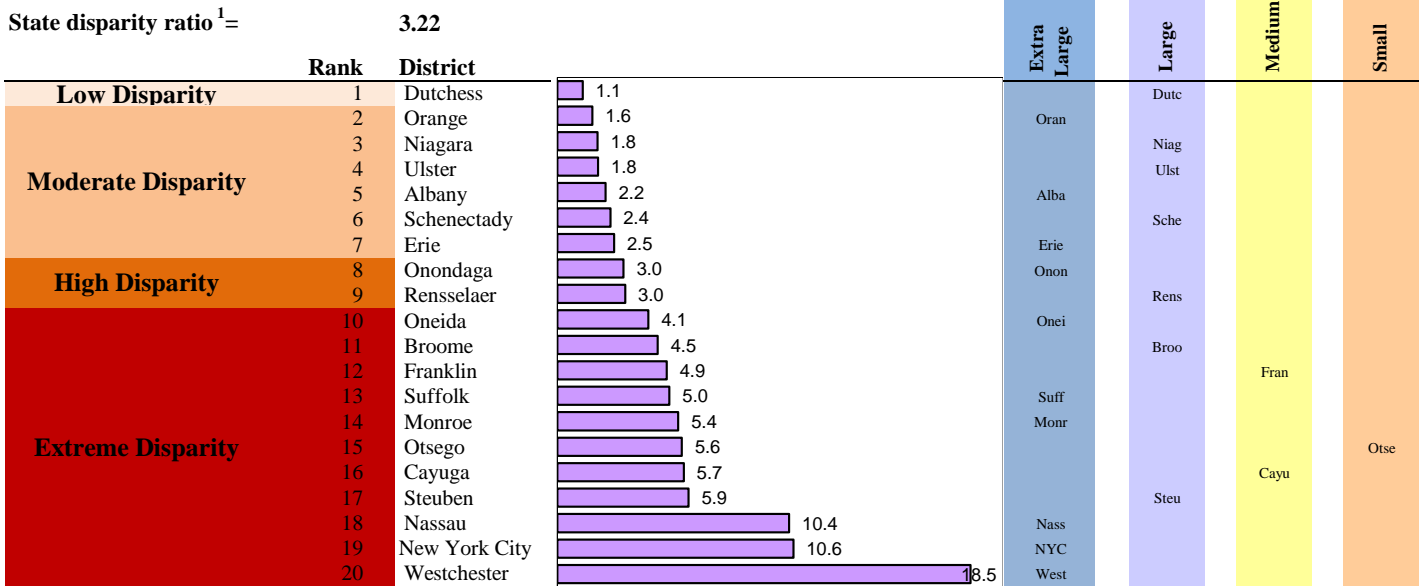

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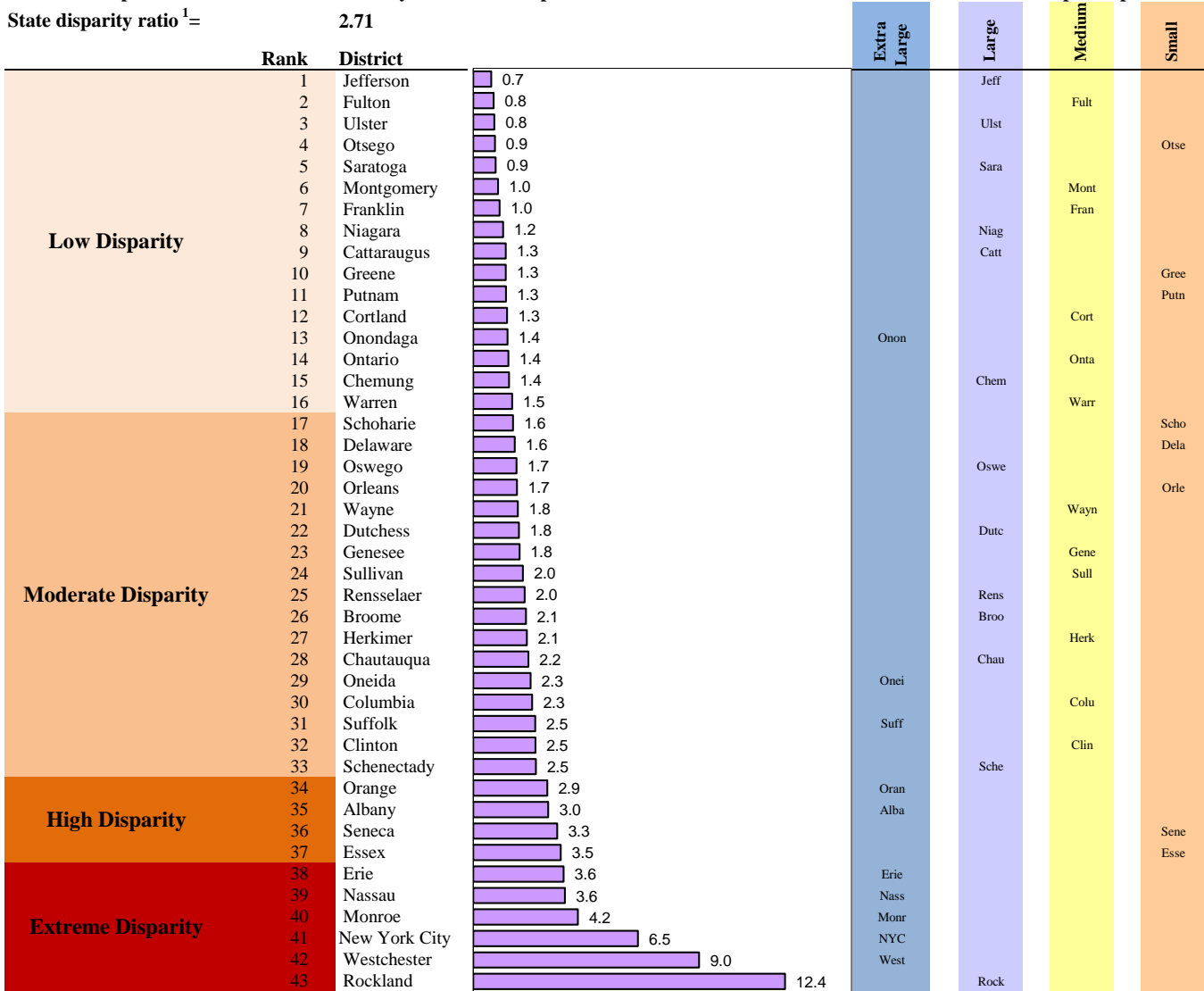

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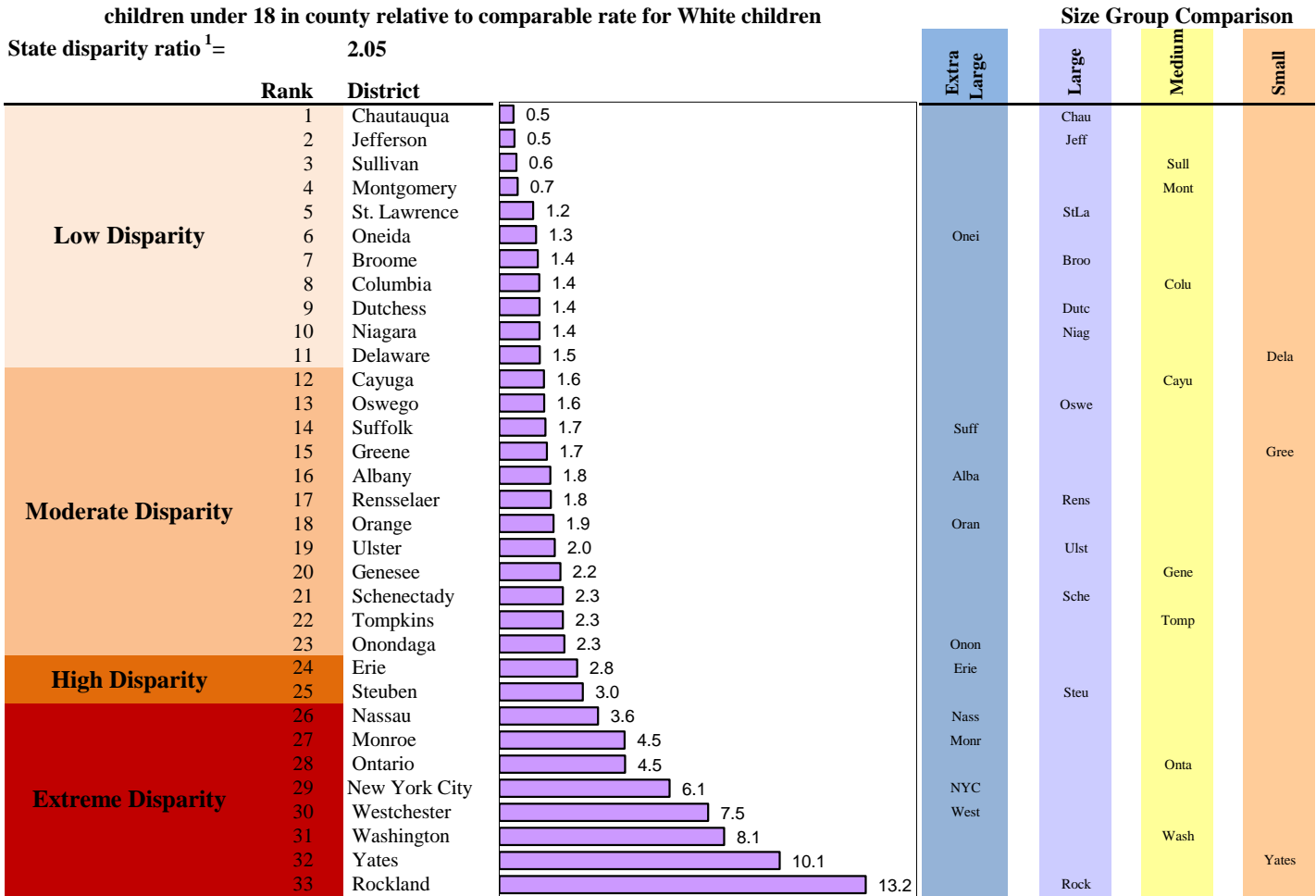

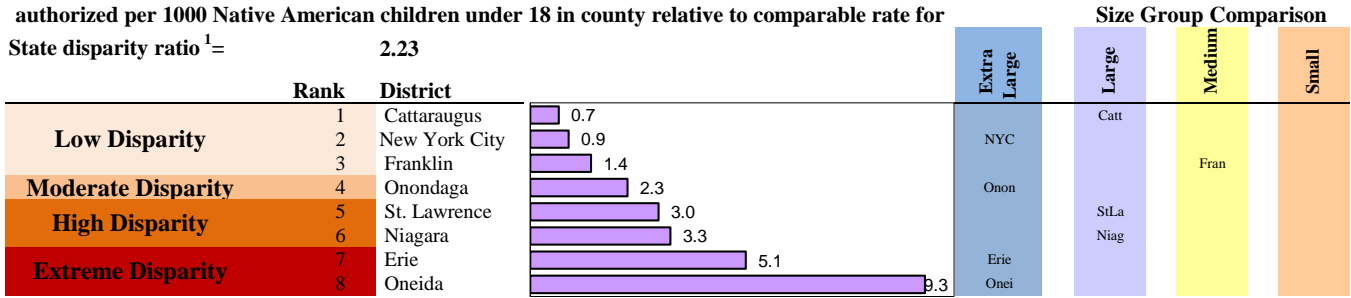

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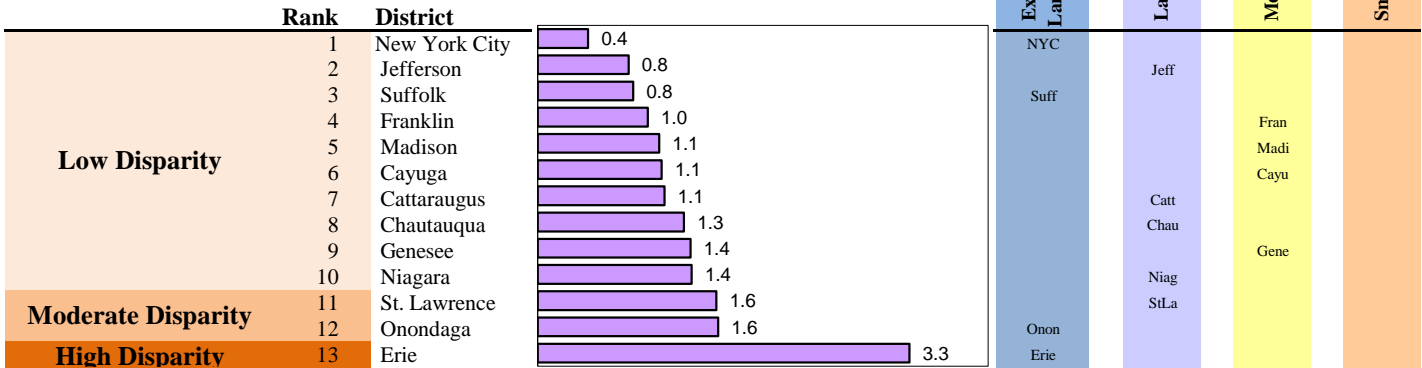
**Native American Disparity Rate: Unique Children in CPS Reports CY 2021**

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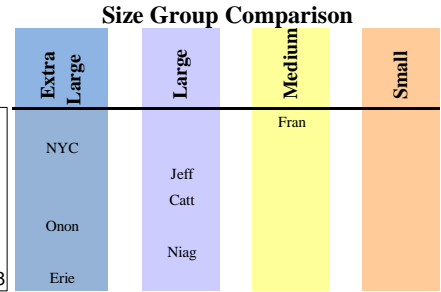

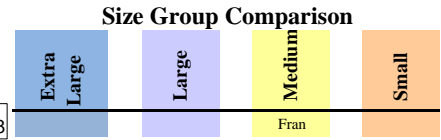

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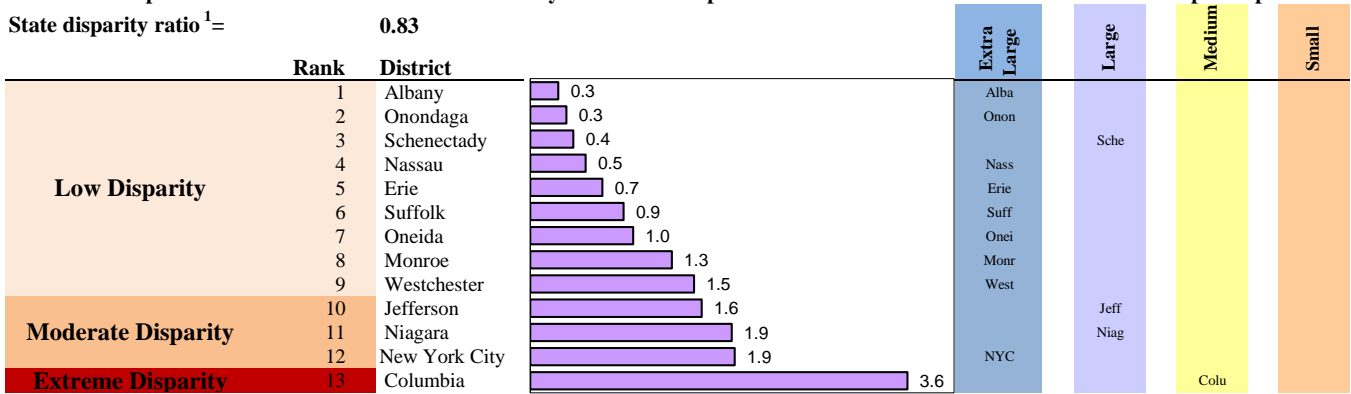

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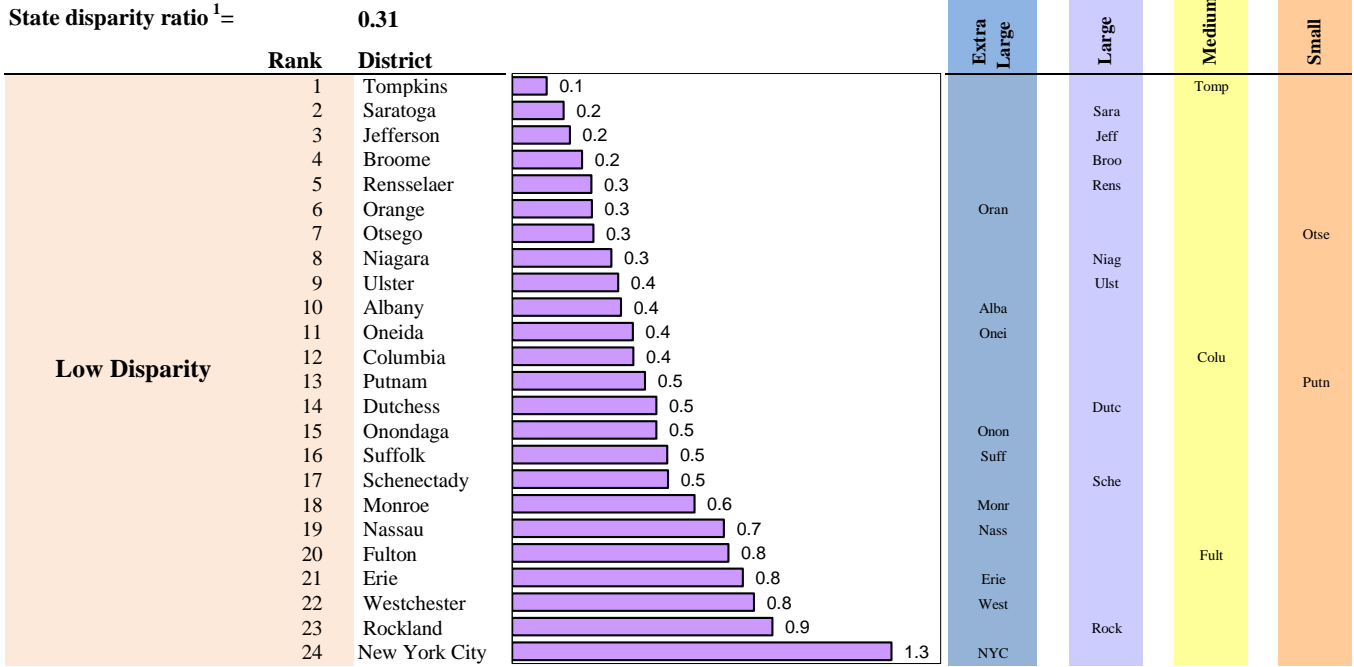

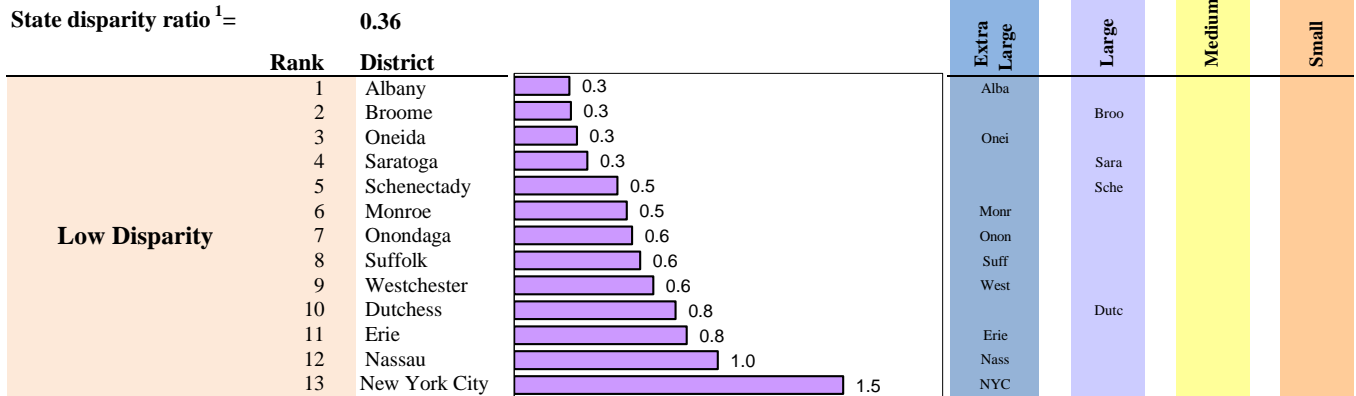

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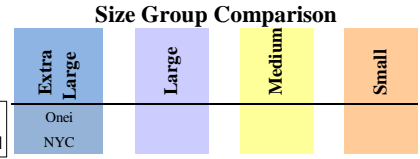

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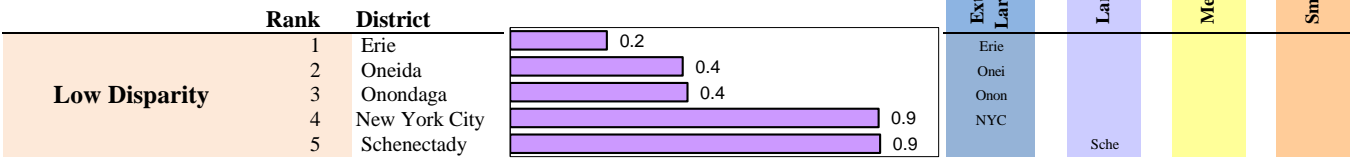
